2020-2021 school year: 130



2. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

We begin the process by determining if the students were eligible to apply for financial aid. If the students were eligible to apply for financial aid, then they were sent a survey composed by the Head of School and the Student Services Coordinator, asking several questions related to Covid-19 and what affect it may have had on them and their education. The surveys were collected and compiled. Then we sat down and analyzed the students' responses and if we needed follow-up with individual students, we, the Head of School and Student Services Coordinator, sat down with the individual students and ascertained our clarification. On completion of the data collection and clarification process we decided to award all the available funds to the students that responded to the surveys, due to the facts that they all were effect equally by Covid-19.
